



A consummate writer, he has published eight books of poetry; and edited the first bilingual collection of poetry in New Mexico, Saludos - all published by Pennywhistle Press, which he established in 1986. Spring Again won the Independent Publisher's Association Bronze Medal in 2007. Di Suvero served as Director of the National Poetry Association for four years and eventually established what is now National Poetry Month, sponsored by the Academy of American Poets. He was a founder of PEN and the New Mexico Book Association; does ongoing work as Project Director for the National Institute for Change, and for the American Immigrant Foundation and Liberty Resources, LLC. His latest publication, We Came to Santa Fe, serves as a beautiful explanation of why Santa Fe has become known as "The City Different."



One of the latter contains a short epic poem (only 2151 lines) about the return of the Holy Grail to the 21st century, and how it got to the Hill Country. He

#### KATHLEEN MCRAE



#### **MELISSA LUMPKIN**



#### PAULA SMALL



#### TIMOTHY HOUSE WADSWORTH, OHIO



#### TONY ZURLO


